What To Bring

- □ Twin-sized sheets/sleeping bag
- Blanket
- D Pillow
- Bath towel
- Extra towel for water activities
- Laundry bag
- Activity clothes

- Paintball clothes if applicable

What Not To Bring

- Electronics of any kind

- Weapons (guns, firearms, knives; *small pocket knives ok*)
- Fireworks
- Tobacco, drugs, alcohol
- Pets
- Sports equipment (skateboards, bikes, paintball/airsoft guns, etc.)
